


### **Principal's News**

If you have had a recent interview with your child's teacher, it is not essential for you to make another interview time at this stage.

### School Uniform

At PPS we pride ourselves on students being dressed in full school uniform each day. We are fortunate that our school community share this value and support the school by sending their children to school each day in our school's uniform.

School uniforms over the course of the year constitute a reasonably large expense for families. Can you please ensure that all school uniform clothing items are clearly labelled with a child's name and class. Should your child accidently bring home another child's clothing could you please ensure it is returned to school the following day.

### <u>2024 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)</u>

The school's Years 3 and 5 students are currently working through the NAPLAN assessments.

NAPLAN is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It is a nationwide measure.

NAPLAN results allow parents / carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time – individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards.

The tests support monitoring and evaluating of the performance of schools and school systems in these fundamental capabilities. The results can assist teachers by providing additional information to support their professional judgement about students' levels of literacy and numeracy attainment and progress.

NAPLAN tests are one aspect of each school's assessment and reporting process and do not replace the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance. Each teacher will have the best insight into their students' educational progress. Parents/carers can use NAPLAN reports, along with other school assessment reports, to discuss their child's strengths and areas for improvement with their teacher.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the 4 areas (or 'domains') of:

- reading
- writing
- conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- numeracy.

### **NAPLAN 2024 parent and carer information**

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is undertaken by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2024 will take place from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school.

In preparation for NAPLAN, our school will undertake activities to help students become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.

The <u>public demonstration site</u> (<a href="https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site">https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</a>) is available to see the types of questions, tools and functions used in the NAPLAN tests.


### **Emailing the school**








**Dance News**

#### **Library News**

Thank you to those children and parents who are returning library books before school on the day the children have their library lesson. With library lessons being so short it allows the children's borrowing to occur with fewer issues.

I would like to remind all parents that the day children have a lesson in the library is not the only time they are able to borrow. They may borrow each school day, either before school (not Tuesdays) or at lunch (not Fridays), if they have their library bag. It is good for the children not to fill their school bags too full, so spreading borrowing over more days in the week will allow the children to carry a lighter load each day. It also helps them to be more independent and responsible while also exposing them to a wider variety of books.

Families who were here last year would be aware that the school has a subscription to *World Book Online*. This subscription is current, and the username and password that you received last year is still valid. A copy of the flyer will be emailed out to each family this week. Please be aware that log in details are NOT to be shared online or with non PPS families. It provides access to not only encyclopaedia articles at a number of ability levels, but also ebooks and other resources your family may find interesting, fun, and useful. One of the interesting and less well known features, found in the settings, is the ability to translate the encyclopaedia articles into a wide range of languages, and also to have the article read aloud.



The Instrumental Program is well and truly off to a great start in Term 1 of 2024.


