We are excited to announce the Pymble Public School has enlisted the services of an organisation that facilitates the NSW Return and Earn recycling scheme, Envirobank.



As part of our partnership with Envirobank, there will be several locations around the school at which students can deposit the containers purchased at the canteen or brought into school from home every day.

Each family will also receive an orange Envirobank bag to take home. We invite you to use this bag to collect your specially marked containers and return to school on the collection day. These may include plastic drink bottles, cardboard juice boxes and aluminium cans. **Glass is not accepted.** For each container returned, PPS will receive most of the 10 cent refund.

This is an opportunity for students to become actively involved in recycling while raising money for our school.

Important things to note:

- Collect and return only containers marked with 10 cent refund
- Only return orange Envirobank bags when completely full
- Securely tie full bag by using the black drawstring at the top
- Do not scrunch containers
- Remove plastic straws and wrapping
- Ensure containers are empty and dry before returning

You may return your full orange Envirobank bag to school every **Tuesday**. When you return a full bag, a new replacement bag will be sent home.




