

This year I will be teaching the majority of classes with the remaining classes by Mrs Jane Shields. The classes coming to the library this year have 30 minute lessons, and so children should, where possible on their library day, return their books to the library when they arrive at school before going to the classroom. This is vital on Wednesdays and Fridays as the children go directly to sport, assembly or scripture and do not have the opportunity to do so at 9 am when all books need to be returned to the library. On Tuesday mornings, when the library is closed the children should still drop their returns and their library bags into the library. With lessons so short, if children arrive at the lesson with books to return there is not sufficient time to return them, and so those children will need to return to the library when it is open to borrow.

Children will usually be given time to borrow in library lessons, but time is available for borrowing every day when the library is open, either before school or at lunch time. The library is usually open to children **before school** on each day EXCEPT Tuesday and is also open on at **lunchtime** each day EXCEPT Friday. I would encourage children to visit the library outside their library lesson to have access to a wider variety of books.

All children in K-4 need a library bag with them in the library to be able to borrow books, while children in years 5 and 6 are able to borrow without a library bag. The children need to be able to open and close their own library bags and a plastic shopping bag is <u>not</u> acceptable. The bag should also be clearly named, and for younger children have something which makes it readily identifiable. The regular reading of a range of books is one of the best ways for children to develop as learners. I am available to assist your children (and you) in choosing books.
