The Forest SRC Student Meeting

Our school captains Crystal W and Ben L have been selected to represent Pymble Public School as part of the establishment of network level Student Representative Councils, aimed at gaining student input towards planning and hearing about matters that are important to students. These Councils will also provide representation, insights and updates to the Minister's Student Council via the Metropolitan North Public Schools Directorate and State level Councils, to relay critical feedback and concerns to the Deputy Premier.

Students selected to be part of these councils will:

- be an integral part of creating a tiered model for student voice that connects schools, communities and the Minister's Student Council (DOVES)
- provide genuine student feedback on educational experiences
- use insights and experience to develop innovative proposals
- take part in a process to elect two network representatives who will represent The Forest Network at Directorate level each term

Crystal and Ben attended their first network SRC meeting at Roseville Public School last Thursday. They will attend one meeting a term and have been asked to provide suggestions for next term's meeting agenda. Both Crystal and Ben are very excited by this opportunity.

Parent Teacher Interviews

New 2025-2028 School Excellence Plan

The school leadership team together with our teaching staff over the past six months have prepared our new 2025 – 2028 School Plan (SEP). Our new SEP continues the school's emphasis on high level school improvement, excellence, student wellbeing, student growth and attainment, community partnerships and evidenced based teaching practices.

Last Thursday morning the school held a SEP Parent Information Session in the school hall. During this session our school's planning processes, background data analysis and strategic directions and major initiatives as part of our new SEP were discussed. Parents and carers had the opportunity to ask clarifying questions.

The school's finalised 2025-2028 School Excellence Plan will be published on the school's website by the end of this term, Friday 11 April.

KISS AND RIDE ZONES

Understanding the rules

Kiss and Ride Zones are for your child's safety and for your convenience.

Designed for quick entry and exit, it minimises congestion

and risk when used properly.

RULES

- Kiss and Ride zones and 'No Parking' zones operate under the same conditions.
- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of two minutes.
- The driver MUST remain in or within three metres of the vehicle at all times.
- The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- Penalties apply for illegally parking in School Zones.
 Rangers are active in the area.



REMEMBER

- DRIVERS DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE To assist with traffic flow in the Kiss and Ride Zone, drivers are encouraged to remain in the car while the children get in and out. To facilitate this, children should travel with bags in the car and not in the boot.
- BE TIMELY If your child does not enter or exit the vehicle within 2 minutes you are required to travel
 around the block and re-enter the zone at the end of the queue.
 (Insert Street names relevant to your school)
- KERB SIDE ENTRY / EXIT Ensure your child enters / exits the vehicle on the kerb side. Ensure your child has their restraint securely fastened before moving off from the Kiss and Ride Zone.
- 4. STAY IN SEQUENCE Please queue in an orderly manner. Drop/pick-up your child as close as you can to the top of the zone, allowing vehicles following you to enter the designated area.
 Do not cut in the queue
- NO U TURNS Do not make u-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk. Fines and demerit points apply.

Kiss and Ride Zones need cooperation to ensure the safety of all children.

Absences from School

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, please either call or email the school office (<u>pymble-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>) detailing your <u>child's full name, class and reason for their absence</u>.

Application for Extended Leave (Travel) Forms

As part of the NSW Department of Education's attendance policy, parents and carers are required to apply for extended leave if their child is going to be absent from school for a period of 5 consecutive days or more. This does not apply for periods of leave due to illness. This applies to planned periods of leave which exceed 5 or more days. Parents and carers can apply for Extended Leave online via the School Bytes Parent Portal under the 'Forms' menu option.


Annual School Contributions




ANZAC Colouring & Poster Competition News

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

School Student Travel



School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use .

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.
